# Vehicle

**If we take a car or a vehicle, we will go through the entrance to Beechwood, then up the hill, until we park at Beechwood Sacred Space.**



# ENTRRANCE



**WE WILL ENTER BEECHWOOD SACRED SPACE THROUGH THE MAIN DOOR.**



**When I come in**

I will give my name to the volunteer in the red Chamberfest shirt. They will welcome me, and can answer any questions I have.

**Devices**

I can ask for noise cancelling headphones.



# BEECHWOOD SACRED SPACE



**Beechwood Sacred Space** is a large hall. It has a main entrance, and a side door that leads to the washrooms. There are places to sit in front and in back.

**Who is sitting with me?**

I will sit next to my family or friends, but I may also sit next to someone I do not know. They are also here to see the concert.

**Accessible Seating**

If I use a mobility device, I will sit where I like. I will be able to see and hear the concert no matter where my seat is.

**There is a beautiful big rock in the middle of the room, and windows high up in the ceiling to let in daylight.**







## Stage

The stage is where the performers will perform.

## Front row

I can walk toward the stage, around the rock, and to the hallways. I cannot touch the stage or the instruments or the performers.

## Concert begins

When it is time for the concert to begin, someone from Chamberfest will introduce the performers. Some people may clap to say hello.

## During the concert

During the concert, I can sit in my seat and listen to the music. I can also dance in my seat, or stand. If I stand, I need to make sure the people behind me can still see. If I need to vocalise or express myself, that is ok. But everyone is here to enjoy the concert.

## Instruments and mats

There are instruments and mats and tunnels for everyone to share.

## Clapping

I can clap at the end of a piece if I like it. Other people will clap too, and this may make a loud sound. If it is too loud, I can cover my ears or put on my sound dampening headphones.

## Back rows

If the concert is too loud from my seat, I can move to the back rows of the space. I can still see from there.



# QUIET AREA AND WASHROOMS

## Quiet area

*It is calmer inside the Quiet Area. I can colour or relax there until I am ready to go back to the concert.*

## Washroom break

*If I need to use the washroom during the concert, my family or friend can take me at any time. There may be whooshing noises from the water when we wash our hands.*

*Our seats will be still be there when we come back.*

## Types of washrooms

*There are washrooms for men and washrooms for women. There is also an accesible washroom where I can go in with a helper. We will choose the washroom we are comfortable using and go to it.*
